

# **KNOW BEFORE YOU GO**

- Sunday in the Park with George is a beloved American musical by Stephen Sondheim and James Lapine that originally premiered off-Broadway in 1983, and on Broadway in 1984. It won the 1985 Pulitzer Prize for Drama.
- This production is directed by Sarna Lapine (a niece of James Lapine), who directed the acclaimed 2017 Broadway revival.
- This production is part of Pasadena Playhouse's 6-month "Sondheim Celebration," which features productions of two of Sondheim's monumental musicals seldom seen in the greater Los Angeles area; an all-new tribute concert starring his most beloved performer, Bernadette Peters; a partnership with the USC School of Dramatic Arts; and additional Sondheim-centered programming.

# SUNDAY IN THE PARK WITH GEORGE

Sunday in the Park with George is a beloved musical by Stephen Sondheim (music and lyrics) and James Lapine (book) that premiered off-Broadway at Playwrights Horizons in 1983. It went to Broadway in 1984 and was nominated for ten Tony Awards that year—it won two, for lighting design and scenic design. The musical takes as its subject the last months of George Seurat's painting of A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte (1884–1886), with themes about the creative process and the relationship between art and life.

The lead roles were made famous by Mandy Patinkin and Bernadette Peters on Broadway.

Sunday in the Park with George was inspired by the time Sondheim and Lapine spent together looking at A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte at the Art Institute of Chicago. The musical fictionalizes Seurat's life and is not an accurate biography.

### **STEPHEN SONDHEIM AND JAMES LAPINE**

Stephen Sondheim and James Lapine's legendary collaboration produced the musicals *Sunday in the Park with George, Into the Woods*, and *Passion*.

**Stephen Sondheim** (1930–2021) was one of the most important talents in twentieth-century musical theater. The *New York Times* called him "the theater's most revered and influential composer-lyricist of the last half of the 20th century and the driving force behind some of Broadway's most beloved and celebrated shows."

Sondheim is credited with reinventing musical theatre. With dazzling lyrics, his musicals address weighty subject matter with emotional and intellectual complexity. In the 1950s, Sondheim wrote the lyrics for *West Side Story* and *Gypsy*. And then in 1962, the first musical with music and lyrics by Sondheim opened on Broadway and won a Tony Award for Best Musical: A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum. Sondheim would go on to write music and lyrics for acclaimed and much-loved musicals including *Company* (1970), Follies (1971), A Little Night Music (1973), Sweeney Todd (1979), Merrily We Roll Along (1981), Sunday in the Park with George (1984), Into the Woods (1987), Assassins (1990), and Passion (1994).

Sondheim received the Kennedy Center Honors for Lifetime Achievement in 1993 and was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by Barack Obama in 2015, among many other honors.

**James Lapine** (b. 1949) is a director, playwright, screenwriter, and librettist who has won three Tony Awards for Best Book of a Musical for *Into the Woods*, *Falsettos*, and *Passion*.

Lapine studied photography and graphic design at CalArts, and taught design at the Yale School of Drama before his plays started being produced off-Broadway in the late 1970s.

In addition to making musicals with Sondheim, Lapine has frequently collaborated with composer William Finn. The Finn-Lapine collaboration has produced *Falsettos*, *A New Brain*, *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*, and *Little Miss Sunshine*.

Also a director, Lapine directed the 2012 Broadway revival of *Annie* and the new musical *Flying Over Sunset*, for which he wrote the book.

#### **GEORGE SEURAT**

**George Seurat** (1859–1891) was one of the most important post-Impressionist painters—specifically, a founder of the French school of Neo-Impressionism known for the technique of Pointillism, in which small dots or strokes of color compose an image that coheres from a distance. A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte (1884–1886) is one of his best-known works.

#### **PASADENA PLAYHOUSE**

The Pasadena Playhouse is one of the most prolific theaters in U.S. history—it has produced about 1,200 shows, commissioned more than 550 new works, and developed several shows that went on to Broadway. The Pasadena Playhouse has also had a historic impact on theatre arts education.

The Pasadena Community Playhouse was founded in 1917 by Gilmor Brown. It was at one time one of the largest theatre complexes in the world, and in its golden era of 1920 to 1945, it was known as the "Star Factory" because so many talents who would become film and TV stars were discovered at the playhouse. From the 1920s through the 1960s, the Playhouse School of Theatre Arts (later the College of Theatre Arts) offered renowned education in the dramatic arts.

Today, the Pasadena Playhouse presents acclaimed theatrical productions, with a mission "to enrich people's lives through theater, community programs and learning." The 2023 Season at the Pasadena Playhouse honors Stephen Sondheim, considered by many as the greatest musical theatre writer of all time, in an ambitious and momentous celebration featuring full-scale productions, special events, and unforgettable performances by Broadway legend Bernadette Peters (*A Little Night Music, Follies*), Larry Owens (*A Strange Loop*), Gay Men's Chorus of Los Angeles, Pasadena Chorale, Vox Femina Los Angeles, and many more.




